He and his wife take a pragmatic approach to agriculture; employing aggressive double cropping, and cover crops, no till, and diverse species are the bedrock of the current paradigm.

Lisa routinely advocates for improving soil health to achieve water quality goals, grow nutrient-dense foods, and enhance farm profitability. She is affiliated with the Stroud Water Research Center, the Pennsylvania Soil Health Coalition, and the Pennsylvania Sustainable Agriculture Board.
